PLEASE READ SCHEDULE CONDITIONS CAREFULLY:

The Show is conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Sunshine Coast Show Society Incorporated and the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.

1. Entries must be the bonafide property of the entrant. Flowers entered must be grown by the Entrant. Potted Plants to have been grown by the Entrant for no less than 3 months.

2. The Show Society will provide containers for all cut flowers.

3. Cut flowers in any section still in bud form at the time of judging will not be considered.

4. Where possible, names of all cut flowers are to be attached to the exhibit.

5. Entry forms must reach the Show Office by 4.00 pm on Wednesday 11th June. 6. Exhibit Entry labels must be attached to all exhibits. If you are unable to print your entry label, please contact the Office.

7. Entries are to be delivered to the Main Pavilion, close to the main entrance on Thursday 12th June between 9.00 am and 12.30 pm. Exhibits will be judged on Thursday 12th commencing from 2.00 pm.

8. Quality will be the first consideration in judging.

9. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of three exhibits in each class. All exhibits will be judged, but in the event of numerous large exhibits in any one class, display cannot be guaranteed. If placing additional entries, please name each entry...ie entry #1, #2 etc.

10. Exhibits may be collected on Monday, June 16th from 7.30 am and 12.00 pm after which remaining items will be disposed of unless prior arrangements have been made with the Chief Steward. Due to Health restrictions and Qld. Health

directives, this may change. Please refer to the Head Floriculture or Pavilion Steward at the Show.

Exhibitors must present their nomination receipt to collect entries or prizes.
Exhibitors are not permitted to interfere with the judging process.

13. Provisions are made for awarding 1st & 2nd place in each class. Judges may withhold any or all places if exhibits are not of an acceptable standard. Classes with less than three (3) entries will only be awarded a first prize.

14. Every care will be taken of exhibits but no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage.

15. All vehicles coming onto the grounds, agree to abide by the SCASS traffic management plan. No vehicle entry during Show operating hours.

PRIZE MONEY and PRIZE CERTIFICATES: No prize money will be paid out if there are any outstanding fees. All prize money will be available for collection from the Cashier at the Treasury, located beside the Main Office as soon as possible after 2.00 pm on the Friday of the Show. All prize money is GST-inclusive. Prizes not collected by 30th June 2025 will be forfeited. Prize cards will not be held after June 30th.

BIO-SECURITY: All Exhibitors entering potted plants into the 2025 Sunshine Coast Agricultural Show must now complete a "Potted Plants Application for Entry/Movement Record" form.
